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Exercise 2: Rewrite the sentences using different conjunctions:

Original: He likes to play basketball and he likes to play soccer too. Rewrite: He likes to play basketball, and he also likes to play soccer.

Original: Sarah went to the store, so she could buy some groceries. Rewrite: Sarah went to the store to buy some groceries.

Original: I don't like chocolate, but I like vanilla. Rewrite: I don't like chocolate, yet I like vanilla.

Original: They can watch a movie or they can play video games. Rewrite: They can watch a movie, or they can play video games.

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Exercise 3: Combine the sentences using the given conjunction:

 - Combined: She wanted to visit Paris, but she couldn't afford it.

- 4.He likes coffee. He doesn't like tea.
 - Combined: He likes coffee, but he doesn't like tea.
- 5. She studied hard. She passed the exam.
 - Combined: She studied hard, and she passed the exam.
